Ahead of the national congresses of the NPC and the CPPCC in March, their provincial, autonomous regional and municipal congresses have elected a new leadership until the end of January.

The China Investment Limited Liability Corporation (referred to as China Investment Corporation for short) was recently established.

In response to a reporter's question, Chinese Premier Wen Jiabao said that the recently established China Investment Corporation is completely of a business nature without government intervention. Its foreign-related activities are not linked to politics. Wen Jiabao said: "We have cautiously treated this issue, but there are still all sorts of comments abroad." He used a Chinese saying "the taller the tree, the stronger the wind it catches" to describe this situation. Wen Jiabao made the above remarks when meeting the press at the Great Hall of the People together with British Prime Minister Gordon Brown. Wen Jiabao said: The recently established China Investment Corporation has drawn much attention in various circles around the world. China's purpose in establishing this corporation is first, to ensure the rational use of foreign exchange and its security and second, to conduct economic cooperation and trade exchanges with various countries. "This investment corporation is completely of a business nature, and it will ensure the security and added-value of China's foreign exchange reserve," Wen Jiabao said. Wen Jiabao pointed out: The China Investment Corporation's registered capital is \$200 billion, but actually its overseas investment is between \$60 to \$70 billion, because \$60 billion of the \$200 billion has already been injected into the China Commercial Bank as capital. The China Commercial Bank's reform has achieved tremendous successes. The next step is that China will continue to push for reforms of other commercial banks and inject capital into these banks through the China Investment Corporation. Wen Jiabao said: The China

Investment Corporation conducts its commercial operations completely according to its management structure without government intervention. They only undertake the responsibility of ensuring and increasing the value of the capital for the government. Its overseas operations are not linked to politics. "We will make efforts so that the investment corporation will maintain the openness and transparency of its overseas activities; in other words, we will enable the people overseas and in the country to know about its operations," Wen Jiabao said. ... BEIJING, Dec. 21 (Xinhua) - Minister of Science and Technology Wan Gang was elected chairman of the Central Committee of China Zhi Gong Dang (CZGD) here on 21 December, marking the end of China's eight democratic parties leadership reshuffle. The CZGD was the last one to close its national congress and elect the new leader. Among the eight leaders, five are new faces and three have taken the second term. "Those who were elected as leaders ten years ago all retired this time," said He Ruli, former chairwoman of the Revolutionary Committee of the Chinese Kuomintang (RCCK), one of the five retired. The new leaders are younger than their predecessors when they took office five years ago. All of them are below 70 and Wan, 55, is the youngest. Several of the new leaders have served at senior government posts. Wan, a Shanghai native, was appointed Minister of Science and Technology in April, when he was then vice chairman of the CZGD Central Committee. He is a renowned engineering scientist and had been the president of Shanghai's Tongji University before taking the minister office. His appointment made him the first non-Communist party minister in China's State Council since the late 1970s, when China launched its economic reform and opening-up drive. Chen Changzhi, new chairman of the China National Democratic Construction Association (CNDCA), is vice-minister of supervision while Yan Junqi, new chairwoman of the Central Committee of the China Association for Promoting Democracy (CAPD), had been the vice-mayor of Shanghai, China's economic hub. "I believe that more and more members of the democratic parties will serve in the government," said Sang Guowei, chairman of the Central Committee of the Chinese Peasants and Workers Democratic Party (CPWDP). Sang is a pharmaceutical expert and had served as vice director of the State Food and Drug Administration between 1999 and 2003. To meet the country's demand, the democratic parties shall work harder to find or foster good talents, he said. "The new leaders are facing challenges on how to pass on the good traditions and lead the parties to play a better role as the participant, adviser and supervisor of the political affairs," said Wan. Being the Science Minister, he said, "The most important thing I have to do is open to

all proposals and opinions, including those from members of democratic parties." The democratic parties are giving a platform to the country's "new social stratum" to voice their political request, said Prof. Zhen Xiaoying, of the Central Institute of Socialism. The new social stratum, officially put forward by former Party leader and Chinese President Jiang Zemin, includes private entrepreneurs, technicians and managerial staff in private or foreign-funded companies and the self-employed and employees in intermediate organizations. Many members of the eight parties are intellectuals, professionals and those with overseas background. Eight of the nine chairman and vice chairpersons of the CZGD are either from overseas Chinese families or have studied abroad. "Being members of these parties, people from the new social stratum get their interests protected and voice heard and enjoy the chance to exchange among one another," Zhen said. (XNA, 21 Dec 07)

Because of its importance, the presidency of the school is always regarded as an influential position that allows the holder to develop connections among the party elite. The appointment puts Mr Xi further ahead of main rival Li Keqiang, a close ally of President Hu Jintao, who is ranked seventh in the party hierarchy. Mr Xi, 54, and Mr Li, 52, were elevated into the all-powerful Politburo Standing Committee in October. It is widely believed one of them will succeed Mr Hu when he steps down in five years. Mr Xi, with better party connections, has an edge over Mr Li, but with five years remaining, the race is far from over. His control over the school will further consolidate the former Shanghai party chief's position. (SCMP, 22 Dec 07)

On Monday, Zhang Yang, Wang Jitang, Zhang Shibo, and Major General Liu Liangkai, political commissar of the PLA Hong Kong Garrison, called on Tsang Yam-kuen, the chief executive of the SAR Government. Tsang congratulated Wang Jitang and Zhang Shibo on their promotions.

Wang thanked the SAR Government and Hong Kong people for their long-time care and support to the PLA Garrison, his own work in particular.

Meanwhile, the new garrison commander said he will work with Liu to lead the PLA officers and men in carrying out their duties, so as to make new contributions to the long-term prosperity and stability of Hong Kong. (XNA, 7 Jan 08; RMRB, 8 Jan 08)

Zheng, a native of Fengtang County, Hebei Province, joined the army in 1969. Since then he had held a series of military positions in land troops and in the navy. These included captain and head of the destroyer division of the South China Sea Fleet of the the PLA Navy, deputy chief of staff of the South China Sea Fleet, and chief of staff of the navy's Fujian base.

In 1997, he became a rear admiral. In 2000, he was appointed head of the Dalian Warship Academy of the PLA Navy. In 2005, he was promoted to deputy commander of the PLA Navy. Last year, he became a Navy lieutenant general. (XNA, 19 Dec 07; RMRB, 26 Dec 07)

Britain (Jan 18)

Beijing, 18 January: Chinese Premier Wen Jiabao held talks with visiting British Prime Minister Gordon Brown, reaching a host of agreements on bilateral cooperation on economic, finance, education, Olympics and others. ... After the talks, the two leaders attended the signing ceremony of nearly 800-million-US dollar contracts on education, energy between the two countries, and a joint statement on climate changes. ... The two sides signed eight agreements worth nearly 800 million US dollars on Friday to cooperate in areas ranging from education to energy. (XNA, 18 Jan 08)

BEIJING, Jan. 18 (Xinhua) - British Petroleum (BP) announced it had signed a series of agreements with China on Friday, including those in clean energy and wind power generation, during British Prime Minister Gordon Brown's visit to China.

Brown and Chinese Premier Wen Jiabao attended the signing ceremony.

Under the agreement, BP and the Chinese Academy of Sciences (CAS), will study the feasibility of setting up a joint Clean Energy Commercialization Centre (CECC) later this year.

The CECC, proposed last year, aims at commercializing clean energy technologies, including coal gratification, coal to liquids, coal to chemicals, carbon capture and storage.

The two sides would use the centre as a platform to promote research and development in the near zero emissions clean coal initiative and launch related pilot programmes.

In a framework agreement with Beijing Tianrun New Energy Investment Co., the two sides said they would jointly invest in three 49.5 megawatt wind power plants in northern Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region. They also agreed to explore further wind power investment opportunities.

According to a memorandum of understanding, BP and China Petrochemical Corporation (Sinopec Group) agreed to add a new 650,000 tons capacity acetic acid plant at their joint venture in the southwestern municipality Chongqing.

The new plant is expected to be operational in 2011 when the annual capacity would reach more than one million tons.

London-based BP has invested more than 4.3bn US dollars in China commercial projects, including natural gas production, fuel and lubricants sales, and petrochemicals manufacturing, since it entered the country in the early 1970s. (XNA, 18 Jan 08)

Congo (Jan 08)

Kinshasa, 8 Jan (Xinhua) - The China Import and Export Bank provided a preferential loan of 245m yuan to the Congolese (Kinshasa) Government to help the government build a nationwide optical cable transmission network.

Chinese Foreign Minister Yang Jiechi, who is currently on a visit to the Congo (Kinshasa); and Mbusa, Congolese (Kinshasa) minister of foreign affairs and international cooperation, signed the relevant agreement in Kinshasa on the afternoon of 8 January. The project will be implemented by the China Telecommunication Construction Corporation.

Mbusa said: With the preferential loan provided by China, the Congolese (Kinshasa) Government will build a nationwide high-speed optical cable line, which will be conducive to invigorating the country's telecommunication industry and bringing about information modernization.

So far, telecommunications between cities in the country and with foreign countries are transmitted through satellites and microwaves.

The costs are very high and telecommunication signals' reliability and safety are low. This has seriously restricted the development of the country's information industry. (Xinhua, 8 Jan 08, in BBC PF, 10 Jan 08)

Japan (Dec 21)

BEIJING, Dec. 21 (Xinhua) - China and Japan signed the final Japanese Yen loan agreement which funds six environment projects in China's inland provinces.

The agreement was signed between Li Yong, China's deputy Finance Minister and Koji Tanami, the governor of the Japan Bank for International Cooperation.

The 46.3-billion-yen (420 million US dollars) loan for the fiscal year 2007 will bring the total amount the Japanese government lent to China since 1979 to 3.316 trillion yen.

Yen loans are part of Japan's official development aid, and are used on environmental projects and infrastructure. Japan has been reducing its official development aid to China from a peak in 2000/2001 in view of its fast-developing economy.

The loan carries an interest rate of 0.65 per cent to 1.4 per cent and has a term of 25 to 40 years.

It will help six cities and provinces in central and western China - including Lanzhou of Gansu province and Nanyang of Henan province - build six projects to reduce air pollution and deal with urban waste. (XNA, 21 Dec 07)

Beijing, Dec. 28 Kyodo - Japan and China reached agreements in the areas of people exchanges, efforts to tackle climate change and new energy research as the leaders of the two countries held summit talks in Beijing.

Senior officials from the two countries signed the three documents after talks between Japanese Prime Minister Yasuo Fukuda and Chinese Premier Wen Jiabao, held at the Great Hall of the People in the morning.

The agreement on people exchanges, signed by Japanese Ambassador to China Yuji Miyamoto and Chinese Deputy Foreign Minister Dai Bingguo, commits the two countries to aim at realizing exchanges of a total of 4,000 youths from both sides annually over four years from 2008.

Those involved in the exchanges will include high school and university students, as well as representatives from economic, academic and cultural entities, the agreement said.

A joint statement on climate change, signed by the science ministers of the two countries, says that the two countries will boost cooperation in the area of science and technology to try to solve the global problem.

As part of their activities, Japan will invite about 50 experts in the area to Japan every year for four years, the document said.

The third document, meanwhile, says the two countries will further cooperate in the research of magnetic fusion energy, as part of an effort to develop a safe and environmentally benign energy source.

The cooperation is a bilateral effort within an international project that aims to demonstrate the scientific and technical feasibility of fusion power, which involves the European Union, Japan, China, India, South Korea, Russia and the United States. (Kyodo News Service, Tokyo, 28 Dec 07, in BBC PF, 29 Dec 07)

Malawi (Dec 28)

Beijing, Jan. 14 (Xinhua) - China and Malawi established diplomatic relations from Dec. 28, 2007, Chinese Foreign Ministry announced here on 14 January.

A joint communique says the governments of China and Malawi, in conformity with the interests and desire of the two peoples, have decided to recognize each other and establish diplomatic relations between the two countries at ambassadorial level as from Dec. 28, 2007.

The Chinese government supports the Malawian government in its efforts to safeguard its state sovereignty and develop its economy, says the joint communique.

The Malawian government recognizes that there is but one China in the world, that the Government of the People's Republic of China is the sole legal government representing the whole of China, and that Taiwan is an inalienable part of China's territory, according to the joint communique.

Chinese Foreign Minister Yang Jiechi and Malawian Minister for Presidential and Parliamentary Affairs Davis Katsonga exchanged views on the future development of China-Malawi relations after signing the joint communique in Beijing. (XNA, 14 Jan 08)

Sierra Leone (Jan 18)

LAGOS, Jan. 18 (Xinhua) - China has signed an economic and technological cooperation agreement with Sierra Leone granting

interest-free loans to the West African country, according to reports from Sierra Leone's capital of Freetown.

The accord was signed by Chinese Ambassador to Sierra Leone Cheng Wenju and Zainab Hawa Bangura, Sierra Leone's minister of foreign affairs and international cooperation. ... (XNA, 18 Jan 08)

Singapore (Jan 07)

SINGAPORE and China signed their first defence agreement, deepening bilateral ties.

The document formalises existing exchanges between the Republic's Ministry of Defence (Mindef) and the People's Liberation Army (PLA), said a Mindef statement.

These include mutual visits, sending personnel to each other's courses and seminars, and port calls.

The deal also covers new ground: The two militaries pledged to work together on humanitarian assistance and disaster relief.

'The signing of the agreement marks a significant milestone in Singapore's bilateral defence relationship and is testament to the growing defence ties between Singapore and China,' said the Mindef statement.

Permanent Secretary for Defence Chiang Chie Foo and PLA Deputy Chief of General Staff, Lieutenant-General Ma Xiaotian, signed the deal at the end of the inaugural China-Singapore Defence Policy Dialogue.

Co-chairing the session, Mr Chiang and Lt-Gen Ma discussed regional security as well as defence exchanges and security cooperation between Singapore and China.

Mr Chiang's three-day visit to China ends today.

During his stay, he called on the Chinese Defence Minister, General Cao Gangchuan, and visited the PLA Academy of Military Science.

The proposal to strengthen bilateral defence cooperation was first raised during Defence Minister Teo Chee Hean's meeting with Gen Cao in Beijing in November 2005.

When Gen Cao visited Singapore in April 2006, the two ministers agreed to work for that in the framework of an agreement. (ST, 8 Jan 08)

Surinam (Dec 27)

Paramaribo, Suriname: China and Suriname have signed several loan agreements which officials say will lead to an aggressive programme to improve port security and infrastructure.

Speaking at a signing ceremony, the officials said one of the main planks of the initiative will be the establishment of a container scanner at Suriname's main port, Nieuwe Haven, in the capital Paramaribo. Beijing will provide a US\$ 3.2 million loan to set up the scanner which will be delivered by Nuctech Co Ltd, China's world-leading container inspection system manufacturer. ...

Meanwhile, the countries have signed an agreement to rehabilitate 500 kilometres of roads in the capital, rural areas and the interior.

The contract, facilitated by a US\$ 214 million loan from the China Export and Import Bank, has been awarded to state-owned Dalian

International Corporation Group Holdings which has already executed two major road improvement projects in Suriname.

Works which are expected to start in the second quarter of 2008 and should be completed in 2010.

Taiwan had offered to implement this project in exchange for diplomatic recognition from the Surinamese government, but Paramaribo rejected the offer and reaffirmed its commitment to the One-China policy. ... Togo (Dec 20)

LOME, Dec. 20 (Xinhua) - China and Togo inked two accords to strengthen cooperation in economic expertise.

Chinese Ambassador Yang Min and Togolese Cooperation Minister Gilbert Bawara signed the two agreements, including 17 million yuan (about 2.29 million US dollars) in grant and a 10-million-yuan (about 1.35-million-dollar) interest-free loan provided by the Chinese government.

Relevant departments of the two countries will negotiate a joint agreement on some projects funded by the money, Bawara said. ... (XNA, 21 Dec 07)

Hong Kong SAR Agreement with Japan (Jan 08)

Hong Kong, Jan. 8 (Xinhua) - The Hong Kong Customs and Excise Department and the Customs Administration of Japan pledged to strengthen cooperation in fighting transnational customs crimes by signing a Customs Cooperative Arrangement.

The Commissioner of the Hong Kong Customs and Excise Department, Richard Yuen, and the Director-General of the Japan Customs and Tariff Bureau, Yukiyasu Aoyama, signed the arrangement at a ceremony, according to a press statement released by the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region government.

"The cooperative arrangement signifies our mutual commitment to elevate our relationship to a new platform as well as our determination to foster stronger cooperation," Yuen was quoted as saying at the ceremony.

The signing of the cooperative arrangement marks the common wish of both administrations to cooperate more closely in various areas, including fighting against smuggling and drug trafficking and protecting intellectual property rights through arrangements of mutual administrative assistance.

So far, Hong Kong Customs has signed Customs Cooperative Arrangements with 11 customs administrations, including customs administration in the Chinese mainland. (XNA, 8 Jan 08)

Hong Kong SAR Agreement with the Mwinland (Jan 30)

Hong Kong, Jan. 30 (Xinhua) - Hong Kong and the Chinese mainland signed in Beijing the second protocol to the Arrangement for the Avoidance of Double Taxation and Prevention of Fiscal Evasion with respect to Taxes on Income, said a press release from the Information Services Department of Hong Kong Special Administrative Region government.

Hong Kong Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury Professor KC Chan signed the agreement with Deputy Taxation Commissioner Wang Li in Beijing, which further clarifies which Hong Kong firms should pay Enterprise Income Tax on the Chinese mainland, the press release said.

The tax arrangement was formally signed on Aug. 21, 2006, and launched on Dec. 8 that year, but both sides have differed on the interpretation of some parts of it. After negotiation they agreed on the amendments and initialed the second protocol last September. (XNA, 30 Jan 08)

PRC Laws and Regulations

Anti-drug law of the People's Republic of China, adopted at the 31st session of the 10th NPC Standing Committee on 29 December 2007. (Presidential Decree No 79, signed by State President Hu Jintao on 29 December 2007) (RMRB, 30 Dec 07)

The anti-drug law, which will take effect on June, 1, 2008, is aimed at curbing drug-related crimes and reducing the growing number of users, especially under-aged addicts.

The law says that owners and managers of discos, bars, nightclubs and other entertainment venues must report drug takers to the police or face punishment. Also under the law, drug addicts might be allowed to undertake treatment in their communities for up to three years, rather than being confined to rehabilitation centres as the current regulation requires.

The law says that minors and pregnant women or those nursing infants less than a year old "are not appropriate for compulsory isolated drug rehabilitation." (XNA, 29 Dec 07)

BEIJING, Dec. 29 (Xinhua) - Chinese lawmakers adopted the country's first-ever anti-drug law in a bid to curb drug-related crimes and reduce the growing number of users, especially under-aged addicts.

The bill says the owners and managers of discos, bars, nightclubs and other entertainment venues are responsible to report drug takers to the police or will be punished otherwise.

The police are authorized, if necessary, to search people and their luggage for illegal drugs at key public places, such as train stations, long-distance bus stations and border crossings.

The number of drug takers in China grew 35 per cent over a five-year period to 1.16 million in early 2005, according to police data. It is estimated that the country has more than 700,000 heroin addicts, of which 69 per cent are under 35.

According to the law, drug addicts might be allowed to recover in their communities in a limited period of three years, rather than being confined to rehabilitation centres as the current drug control regulation requires.

The bill says "drug-addicted minors under 16, pregnant women and those who breast-feed babies less than one year old are not appropriate for compulsive isolated drug rehabilitation."

Lawmakers said it was imperative to introduce the anti-drug law to crack down on drug-related crimes, protect public health and maintain social order.

The law also sets strict rules on the clinical use of pharmaceuticals and other chemicals and medicines that could be used to make illegal narcotics, such as methadone and ephedrine.

Opium, heroin, marijuana, methamphetamine hydrochloride - commonly known as "ice" - morphine and cocaine were listed as banned drugs in the bill, which was introduced to legislation in August 2006.

The bill stipulates that Chinese police should share information with other countries and international organizations and enhance collaboration in investigations. (XNA, 29 Dec 07)

Law of the People's Republic of China on labour dispute mediation and arbitration, adopted at the 31st session of the 10th NPC Standing Committee on 29 December 2007. (Presidential Decree No 80, signed by State President Hu Jintao on 29 December 2007) (RMRB, 30 Dec 07)

According to NPC statistics, labour disputes have risen continuously in recent years. Those statistics also show that labour dispute arbitration organizations at various levels dealt with 1.72 million cases involving 5.32 million employees from 1987 through 2005, with a growth rate of 27.3 per cent annually. Wu Bangguo said that the law on mediation and arbitration is another important law aiming at improving China's labour system, following the adoption of the laws on labour contracts and employment promotion earlier this year.

Under the arbitration law, an organization is entitled to establish its own labour mediation committee to solve internal disputes at its own level. Such a committee should include employees and management representatives.

Wu said the law, which is aimed at solving labour disputes fairly and in a timely manner, will better protect employees' interests and help promote harmonious labour relations. (XNA, 29 Dec 07)

BEIJING, Dec. 29 (Xinhua) - China's top legislature adopted a law on labour dispute mediation and arbitration aimed at "fair and timely" settlement of disputes and lower costs for workers seeking to safeguard their rights. The new law takes effect on May 1, 2008.

After three readings, the law was approved by lawmakers attending the weeklong 31st session of the Standing Committee of the National People's Congress (NPC).

"To solve labour disputes fairly and in a timely way, the law has strengthened the role of grassroots mediation institutions, improved the arbitration system, and clearly stated that labour dispute arbitration is free of charge," said Wu Bangguo, the NPC Standing Committee chairman, who presided over the closing session.

"It will shorten the cycle of labour dispute settlement, lower the cost for labourers to safeguard their lawful rights, and is conducive to the development of harmonious relations between employees and employers."

The new law has four chapters and 54 clauses, and it follows the labour contract law and the law on employment promotion in being approved this year to improve China's labour systems. (XNA, 29 Dec 07)

The amendment to the tax law raises the monthly individual income tax levy threshold from 1,600 yuan (218 US dollars) to 2,000 yuan.

The change was intended to ease the burden for low-and middle-income earners in light of recent increases in consumer prices. The amendment will take effect on March 1, 2008.

The law on individual income tax has been amended three times over the past five years. In October, 2005, the Standing Committee of the National People's Congress (NPC) amended the law to raise the individual income tax levy threshold from 800 yuan to 1,600 yuan.

Last June, the legislature changed the law again to authorize the State Council to suspend or reduce the 20-per cent tax on interest earned on personal savings, depending on economic and social conditions.

"The three amendments were made to offset the increase of people's living expenses and aimed at easing the tax burden of medium-and low-income families," Wu Bangguo, NPC Standing Committee chairman, said at the closing session. (XNA, 29 Dec 07)

Beijing, Dec. 29 (Xinhua) - China's top legislature adopted an amendment to raise the individual income tax threshold from 1,600 yuan (about 220 US dollars) a month to 2,000 yuan, a change intended to ease the burden of medium-and low-income earners facing higher living costs.

The amendment will go into effect as of March 1, 2008.

The change will reduce government revenues by 30 billion yuan a year, according to official statistics. But it will also mean that 70 per cent of income earners will be exempt from income tax, against 50 per cent now.

The consumer price index climbed 6.9 per cent in November, marking the fourth consecutive month the index had risen more than 6 per cent. These price hikes have already burdened ordinary citizens.

The individual income tax cut-off point was raised from 800 yuan a month to 1,600 yuan starting in 2006. This was based on consumption expenditures for basic living costs at the time.

"Over the past two years, basic living costs further increased. This required us to readjust the individual income tax starting point again," Finance Minister Xie Xuren told a legislative session of the NPC Standing Committee.

Yang Jingyu, Chairman of the Law Committee of NPC Standing Committee, said that the majority of members of the Standing Committee supported the new threshold and some even thought it should be higher.

The revenue of Chinese governments at all levels has increased by more than 20 per cent in recent years, much faster than gross domestic product (GDP) has grown, and debates on whether Chinese are being overtaxed have grown more frequent.

Chinese President Hu Jintao said in his report to the 17th National Congress of the CCP in October that China will establish a more scientific revenue system to benefit the people.

The government reduced the tax rate on interest income from 20 per cent to 5 per cent on Aug. 15 to benefit medium-and low-income earners.

The latest tax cuts, along with a reduction in the corporate income tax rate starting in 2008, will cut tax revenues by nearly 200 billion yuan.

According to the State Taxation Administration, China's total revenue in 2007 will increase about 1.1 trillion yuan.

"Compared with the total revenue increase, the reduction of individual income tax will not have many side effects, but it will do much to reduce people's tax burden," An Tifu, vice president of Chinese Taxation Institute, told Xinhua.

According to chief economist of National Bureau of Statistics Yao Jingyuan, China's Consumer Price Index (CPI) will surge by 4.7 per cent in 2007, much higher than those of previous two years.

Some NPC Standing Committee members have suggested that the cutoff point should lift to 3,000 yuan per month since if the CPI continues to increase at such a speed, the threshold of 2,000 yuan will be too low again in just a few years.

Other scholars also argued that frequent adjustments of individual income tax threshold will ruin the stability of legislation and appealed to fluctuate the threshold with change of CPI. (XNA, 29 Dec 07)

BEIJING, Jan. 25 (Xinhua) - The temporary price intervention policies taken by the Chinese government are both legal and

common practices in mature market economies, the People's Daily, the mouthpiece of the Chinese Communist Party, said in a commentary Friday.

The commentary came after criticisms which challenged the legitimacy of the government move.

The newspaper said it is the bounden duty for the government to maintain food supply, ease the soaring prices and ensure people a stable and enjoyable life.

Surges in prices of staples such as grain, pork and edible oil since May 2007 have lifted the consumer price index (CPI) to 4.8 per cent in 2007, and an 11-year high of 6.9 per cent in November, well above the government's three-per cent target.

"People's lives, particularly those of the have-nots, have been affected by the price rises! Under these circumstances, the central government launched the interim price intervention in a move to curb irrational price rises, regulate the market and sooth the inflation fear," said the commentary.

In addition, Article 30 of the Price Law was quoted to prove that the intervention carried out by the National Development and Reform Commission, the country's top planner and regulator in economic affairs, is proper and legitimate in both theory and procedure.

"The State Council and the governments at provincial levels can intervene on prices through setting a limit in price discrimination and margin rates, requiring the enterprises to submit price-raising scheme to the government for official approval and implementing a put-on-record system," the law stipulated.

The commentary said the Chinese government respects the law of the market and emphasized the price intervention is aimed at irrational price-raising practices, such as hoarding and cornering, spreading fabricated information and disrupting the market order.

Similar price intervention policies were also taken by other governments like France in 1986 and Japan in 1973, the newspaper said.

The commentary said the price control policy has been hugely welcomed by the people.

"It is time to implement price control," "The irrational price rises shall be stopped," "The price intervention would help us out of the price panic," some people were quoted by the paper as saying. (XNA, 25 Jan 08)

While announcing price controls on a number of daily necessities, China's pricing authority explained the difference between the latest price intervention and an infringement of enterprises' pricing autonomy.

Such an explanation is badly needed because price controls look increasingly like an anachronism in China today.

After three decades of market-oriented economic reforms, the country has liberalized more than 95 percent of the domestic prices of goods and services.

To facilitate pursuit of energy-saving and environmentally-friendly sustainable development, Chinese policymakers also recognized the necessity to remove the lid on oil prices, one of the few

remaining prices under government control, to balance supply and demand as well as reflect environmental cost.

Under such circumstances, a sudden reintroduction of price controls over household commodities - the pricing of which has long been left to the market - must be mind-bending, not only for the suppliers.

The National Development and Reform Commission, the country's pricing authority, issued a circular on interim price intervention on 16 January 2008, covering products like grain, edible oil, meat, milk, eggs and liquefied petroleum gas. The circular also required major enterprises to submit price-raising schemes for official approval.

Clearly, the move marks a policy response to the country's surging inflation which has hovered above 6 percent for five months.

To prevent the rapid rise in prices, especially for food, from evolving into serious inflation, it is imperative for the government to check illegal or speculative price hikes.

More than likely, some enterprises will try to capitalize on soaring inflationary expectations with excessive price gains. And such price speculation can seriously undermine the government's efforts to stabilize overall prices and cause unnecessary consumer panic.

It is in this sense that the pricing authority is justified to take pre-emptive price intervention measures as the annual Spring Festival shopping spree is approaching.

It is worth taking the trouble to stress that the intervention is only temporary and aimed at undue price hikes. Only when enterprises are assured of their legitimate pricing autonomy can they decide what to produce and in what proportions in line with supply and demand in the market. (CD, 18 Jan 08)

Enforcement measures of the National Development and Reform Commission on carrying out interim price intervention measures concerning some important products and services. The measures consist of 16 articles. (Full text: RMRB, 17 Jan 08)

Decision of the State Council on revoking part of the government statutes. (Decree No. 516 of the PRC State Council, signed by Wen Jiabao, Premier of the State Council, on 15 January 2008) It will become effective on the day of promulgation. (Full text of the list: RMRB, 24 Jan 08)

The State Council, or cabinet, recently checked all the 655 statutes that were literally in force and found that 92 of them are no longer effective, according to an official with the Legislative Affairs Office of the State Council.

These statutes were out of date because there had been new laws or statutes to replace them, or that they had simply expired, the official noted.

He cited the Temporary Provisions on the Tax of Banqueting, one of the 92 revoked administrative statutes.

The statute was enacted as early as 1988, but soon the central government found it difficult to collect the tax for various reasons. For instance, most restaurant owners were reluctant to do so for fear of losing clients.

Later, the government transferred the rights of levying the tax to local governments, but the latter were reluctant to do so as they saw banquets as a good way to stimulate local restaurant business, tourism and the local economy as a whole.

Official statistics show that between 1988 and 1994, the country collected a total of 870,000 yuan (currently one US dollars equals 7.3 Chinese RMB yuan) in banqueting tax.

As of 2002, north China's Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region became the last province to stop collecting the tax.

In the near future, the official said, the Legislative Affairs Office of the State Council planned to publish a Collection of Existing Statutes, with certain amendments to contents that were not up to the requirements of economic and social development. (XNA, 24 Jan 08)

BEIJING, Jan. 10 (Xinhua) - Chinese safety watchdog publicized **temporary provisions on uncovering hidden dangers in the workplace**, another effort to improve the country's work safety conditions.

The provisions promulgated by the State Administration of Work Safety, which would take effect on February 1, 2008, stipulated that any person or unit could report directly to the safety watchdog on spotting potential dangers in the workplace in a timely manner.

The provisions also ordered enterprises and mines to file quarterly and annual work safety reports to the administration. Those who do not provide these reports on time or try to cover up accidents would be named and pay a fine equal or less than 30,000 yuan (4,120 US dollars).

Those enterprises and mines that can not meet the work safety requirements would be closed down, according to the provisions.

Official statistics showed that 5.07 million potential dangers in the manufacturing, mining, business and transportation sectors had been uncovered during check-ups by the end of 2007, 94.4 per cent of which had been put into good order.

As the world's largest coal producer, the country had been striving to improve work safety in its accident-prone coal mines. But accidents were still frequent as enforcement was lax and mine owners pushed production beyond safety limits to earn higher profits.

In 2006, China produced 2.4 billion tons of coal. Accidents in small mines with an annual capacity below 300,000 tons each, however, claimed 3,431 lives.

A gas blast on December 29, 2007 at the Shunfa coal mine in northeast China's Heilongjiang Province killed 19 miners. The administration called on mines and enterprises to draw on lessons from the accident.

Northeast China's Heilongjiang Province, abundant in coal resources, closed 273 small coal mines last year and plans to close another 100 small ones this year, according to the provincial safety watchdog.

According to an earlier report of the State Administration of Work Safety, China has closed 10,412 coal mines in the last three years

amid efforts to improve workplace safety and to limit use of natural resources.

The administration said it would step up work safety checks and law enforcement especially before and during the coming Spring Festival in February. (XNA, 10 Jan 08)

The State Council, China's Cabinet, publicized a **regulation on nurses** on 4 February 2008, aiming to safeguard their legal rights and interests, and regulate their work.

The regulation, to become effective on May 12, said the dignity of nurses and their personal safety were protected against infringement.

Those who impede nurses to practice their legal services, insult, threaten or beat them, must be punished according to the law.

The regulation made clear the establishment of a nurse registration system, nurses' rights and interests and their responsibilities, excellency awarding, and the responsibilities of medical institutions in safeguarding their rights and interests.

It said only those who had received three years of professional training and passed an eight month clinical practice could apply for nurse practitioners' exams. "Only those who passed the exams can be licensed as nurse practitioners," it stressed.

It also said health departments can suspend or even revoke a nurse's license if she does not timely inform doctors of the patient's serious condition and led to serious consequence.

The regulations demanded hospitals employ enough full-time nurses so as to provide satisfactory services to patients. An official with the State Council's legal affairs office noted some hospitals do not employ enough full-time nurses but recruit a few part-time nursing workers to save cost.

It also urged nurses to faithfully fulfil their duties, improve their services and strengthen observation on patients.

The regulation urged local governments above the township levels to improve the working conditions of nurses and enhance their salaries and other related awards so as to improve nursing services.

"Nurses are an important component of the medical force and their work is closely tied to medical security and people's health," said the official, stressing "it is very important to attract qualified staff to this sector". (XNA, 4 Feb 08)

Beijing, Dec. 24 (Xinhua) - China has published a guideline for the development of the logistic sector of the Chinese People's Liberation

Army (PLA), that plans the route to a modern, efficient and flexible logistic sector for the Army by the year 2020.

Hu Jintao, State President and Chairman of the Central Military Commission, recently signed a decree to circulate the **"Guideline on the Comprehensive Development of the Modern Logistic Sector"** for the Army.

By 2010, the PLA will make substantial achievements in logistic modernization, to make it capable of meeting logistic demands for fighting emergency wars; and, the Army will achieve an overall modernization for its logistic sector, so as to be able to fight and win wars in the Information Age, according to the guideline.

The guideline, which went into effect on Dec. 12, will "greatly accelerate our Army's logistic modernization," said Lieutenant General Li Maifu, deputy director of the PLA General Logistic Department, in an interview with Xinhua on Monday.

According to the Lieutenant General, the PLA started its logistic reform on a trial base in 2004, and in April this year, the reform entered a new stage as the PLA Jinan Military Area Command took the lead to adopt an integrated logistic supply for all its subordinate units, no matter if they were army, navy or air force units.

For decades, the PLA had organized its own logistic supply. Now, under the guideline, the Army will introduce more and more civilian suppliers.

So far, 5,200 barracks of the PLA have employed civilian suppliers for catering and medical services. Meanwhile, 95 per cent of the Army's clothing and quilts are provided by civilian manufacturers.

Through reforms, the Army has cut its staff working for logistics service by more than 60,000. (XNA, 24 Dec 07)

Decision on issues related to methods for selecting the Chief Executive of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR) and forming the HKSAR Legislative Council in 2012 and on issues relating to universal suffrage.

NPC Chairman Wu Bangguo said that the adoption of the methods was an important decision made by the NPC Standing Committee regarding the development of Hong Kong's political system.

He said the decision was significant to comprehensively implement the principle of "one country, two systems," "Hong Kong people governing the HKSAR," and the high degree of autonomy, as well as the HKSAR Basic Law.

It will also ensure Hong Kong's democratic system will develop in line with the HKSAR Basic Law and in a gradual, progressive and healthy way, and it will maintain and promote long-term prosperity and stability in Hong Kong, Wu said.

In relation to the methods, the NPC Standing Committee decided that appropriate amendments may be made to the specific method for selecting the fourth HKSAR chief executive and the specific method for forming the fifth term HKSAR Legislative Council in 2012.

The committee also decided that the election of the fifth HKSAR chief executive in 2017 may be implemented through universal suffrage.

After the chief executive is selected through universal suffrage, the election of the HKSAR Legislative Council could follow suit, with all of its members to be elected in the same manner.

The committee decided that the election of the fourth HKSAR Chief Executive in 2012 would not be implemented through universal suffrage. Also, the election of the fifth term HKSAR Legislative Council in 2012 would not be implemented by electing all members through universal suffrage. (XNA, 29 Dec 07; RMRB, 30 Dec 07)
